## GENEALOGICAL COMPUTING

A new method is available for storing, sorting, printing and transferring genealogical data. The age of computers is here and has been adapted to Genealogy. The "Family Historical Forum" in Fairfax, Virginia has been in operation for two years. By a simple telephone call my computer will talk with the "Forum" computer. Others, all over the United States, are utilizing the same method, so everyone with a computer and genealogical interest can tie in one central point.

Features available from the "Forum" include; queries surname file, messages to other researchers, barter club and other miscellaneous.

We are utilizing the "Forum" with our Apple Computer and would like to invite you to utilize it also. We will act as a switchboard and will input information or messages for a fee (as this is a long distance call to Virginia).

You can take advantage of the "Family Historian Forum" without a computer through their Newsletter "Genealogical Computing" which is printed every other month.

You can also add your surnames, and queries to the list by writing to "Family Historian Forum"

Subscription rate is \$12.00 per year for the Newsletter. Up to 10 names can be listed for one year for \$3.00 (be sure to include your name, address and phone number with list). Queries are \$2.50 per issue for 5 lines.

The "Forum" received about 6,000 calls last year and it is definitely on the increase. I feel that this new, innovative, electronic mode is here to stay and expand in the years to come.

Presently there is work underway to link other resources into access for home computers. The benefit of all of this comes from being able to do research out of your own home in every state in the United States and even abroad.

GRIFET, Henry b. 25 June 1895 in Texas married Fannie HOLT b. 23 May 1895 in Oklahoma. Lived in Marietta, Love Co, Oklahoma 1918 to ? D. 19 Nov 1929 Soldiers Tubercular Sanatorium in Sulphur, Ok, buried Purcell, Ok. Henry son of Jim GRIFET and Nellie GRAY both born in Texas.

GARFETT, Dock Dencey b June 1862 some records say in South Carolina and others say Georgia. Married Ann Eliza MURPHY (MURFHEY) b June 1859 in Collin Co, Texas. Both lived in Collin Co, until death, Dock died in 1945 and Annie died in 1933.

MURFHEY, William (father of Ann Eliza) b. ca 1816 North Carolina. Married Dorothy b ca 1818 in Tenn. Searched in 1950 Census in Morgan Co, Indiana where they are living with James B. And Mary A.
