CHURCH YARD OF MITPODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH, SOUTH CALLED SHILOH 1889-1972

In 1889 services were first organized by Ar. E.V. Johnson. Ground for the first of three churches which occupied the site was donated by his brother-in-law, Ar. Abbert W. Yeargin. Lev. 1.1. Henry, first in a series of circuit-riding ministers, was appointed in October 7, 1889.

In 1890 a little maples boy died and additional acreage was acquired from hr. Yeargin for the cemetary. Thurch yard and cemetary comprised two acres of land located one-half mile north of Slaughterville hoad on 72nd hoad, Sec. 8-T 7 N- h 1 W, Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

At one time an attempt was made by Ar. Henry Gibbs to locate and mark all of the graves. However, many of the marking stones were removed by someone who was temporarily responsible for nowing the grass. The following record update was conducted by Inez Eurnan King and Hary Ann King, members of the last congregation to attend Philoh Methodist Church.

PAPER CONSERVATION

The value of paper conservation cannot be overemphasized.

If you are one of the lucky genealogists who have in your possession old letters, diaries or manuscripts from your ancestors, you need to take steps now in order to preserve them for the future.

"Collection of objects is pointless if they are not to be preserved," says the Minnesota Historical Society.

Paper is made to "self-destruct." This deterioration of paper is caused by many factors, perhaps the most significant of which are the kinds of materials and chemicals which are used in the paper making process.

A Brief History of Paper

Paper gets its name from papyrus, a reed which the ancient Egyptians used for making writing material. The Egyptians cut the papyrus stalks into thin slices and pressed them into sheets.

Very early paper was almost all fiber like cotton, linen, and rags. The rags were wetted, rolled into balls, and set in moist piles to ferment for 4-6 weeks. Later, these rags were beaten into a pulp for making paper.

The demand for paper was very light until the eighteenth century. As the need for paper increased, ground wood was used for making paper pulp by the Germans in 1840. Paper produced at this time had a higher fiber content than the paper made today. This older paper is probably much more stable than paper made during this century.

The current process for making paper uses wood that has been ground up and processed, then pressed into paper. This modern paper contains a high lignin and acid content. These chemicals tend to break down under prolonged exposure to light and oxygen to form damaging self-destroying acid over a period of time.

Although these factors are primarily responsible for discoloration and embrittlement of papers, additional damage can be caused by dust, dirt, mold, insects, and rodents.

The Environment

Here are several environmental factors to consider in the storage of paper documents.

- 1. Temperature. The room needs to be maintained somewhere between 60-70 degrees Fahrenheit. A constant temperature is preferable to one that fluctuates.
- 2. Humidity. The humidity needs to be between 45-60%. Therefore, except in special situations, this excludes the storage of paper in the attic or basement. In order to maintain a stable atmosphere, air conditioning is suggested. This not only controls the temperature but also the humidity.
- 3. Light. It is best to keep light, both natural and artificial, at a minimum. If you are displaying an object, it needs to be placed where it is never in direct sunlight. This light can cause it to fade and can increase the rate of breakdown in the structure of the paper.
 - 4. Clean storage area. Keep free of dust, dirt, mold, insects, and rodents.

How To Care For Your Paper Heirlooms

When you first find old family documents, you need to stop and think before you pick them up and handle them. Ask yourself the question, "What do you want to do with these documents?"

"Plan on where you are going to put them. Then, use clean white cotton gloves to handle them or use very clean hands. Remember that you have oils in your skin and that these can cause problems with your paper," suggests Kathleen M. Wallis, Director of the Cleveland County Historical Museum.

If you have a series of letters and they are folded and in envelopes, keep the envelopes. Keep the stamps on the envelopes because they are more collectable and a better document if they are left on the envelope. Unfold the letter and keep it with the envelope, especially if it is prestatehood.

"I would recommend using file folders. If you can afford to buy archival folders, I would use those since they have reduced acid," Kathleen says. "If you do not purchase archival folders, I would suggest frequently changing the file folders and not keeping them forever. They, too, will break down since they are made of acid paper. All folders and storage boxes should be 'acid free' and have a pH of 8.5 and a 3% calcium carbonate buffer added. Additionally, all materials should be free of ground wood and lignin if possible."

There is no logical source to buy acid-free folders and boxes. These have to be ordered through the mail at a slightly higher cost. In the long run, when you are preserving very valuable old documents which are not replaceable, they are well worth the cost. Be sure to label the folder, just opening lets in the light and dirt.

If you are looking at plastics, the most inert one is Mylar. It's a polyester product so beware that it will generate static electricity. This could be damaging as it could lift the film off the surface of a photograph.

Polyethylene is very soft and comes in sleeves for papers and post cards, etc. It doesn't offer as much support as Mylar. Be careful of the plastic notebook pages you can buy at the store, the black center sheet may not be acid-free.

Thing to Avoid

Do not use staples, paper clips, rubber bands or scotch tape. Metal clips and staples will rust with the humidity in the air, even if they don't get wet. Scotch tape will leave a stain on the paper which is permanent. Rubber bands will disintegrate and leave a mark. You can buy plastic paper clips, not plastic-coated wire clips, if you must attach items together for storage.

Do not laminate. This is a non-reversible process. Adhesive in the laminate over a period of time forms a chemical reaction and eventually you will get a transparent or translucent stain on the paper. There is nothing you can do to stop it or remove it. Do not laminate items you intend to keep.

Do not roll papers or documents, even larger ones, if you can avoid it. Paper is very pliable when it is new but, as it ages, it becomes more brittle. If it is rolled, often times you cannot unroll it without damaging it and breaking the surface of the paper. This is especially true of photographs.

By applying a few simple environmental conservation storage techniques, we can all extend the quality and life span of paper, books, and other artifacts placed in our care. In our next newsletter, we will discuss conservation of photos, larger pieces, and multiple items.

BY LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Cleveland County Genealogical Society, Inc.

ARTICLE II -OBJECTS

The objects of the Society are to promote the education and knowledge of the membership and the public in research; to acquire and make available historical and genealogical information; and to promote the recording and preservation of genealogical records.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. There are three classes of membership: individual, family (two persons residing at the same address), and life.

Section 2. The membership of this Society shall be open to any person and/or family who support the goals and objectives of this Society, and upon the payment of the prescribed annual dues.

Section 3. The Board of Directors may provide for all types of membership and shall set appropriate dues for the various categories of membership.

Section 4. Annual dues shall be payable on the first day of each calendar year and become delinquent on the first day of the following month.

Section 5. The full annual membership is payable regardless of the month in which the member joins.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 1. The Board of Directors of this Society shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, and Secretary, a Treasurer, the immediate Past President, and three Members-at-Large.

Section 2. At the regular May meeting of the Society, a Nominating Committee of three members shall be elected by the membership. At the June meeting, they shall present the slate of officers for election by the membership and for installation.

It shall be the duty of this committee to nominate candidates for the offices to be filled at the June meeting. The nominating committee shall report at the regular meeting in June. Before the election, additional nominations from the floor shall be permitted. All nominees must have accepted nomination prior to election.

Section 3. The officers shall be elected by the majority of votes cast.

Section 4. A vacancy in any elected office shall be filled by the election of a member in good standing of the Society by the elected officers.

Section 5. The term of the elected officers shall be from 1 July through 30 June or until successors are elected and installed. The fiscal year of the Cleveland County Genealogical Society, Inc. shall also be from 1 July through June 30.

Section 6. Duties of elected officers:

- a. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society; perform other duties as required by the Board of Directors; appoint committees as may be deemed necessary; and be a member ex-officio of all committees, except the nominating committee.
- b. The First Vice President shall preside and perform all the duties of the President in the absence of that officer and all other duties as may be prescribed by the President; shall serve as chairman of the Program Committee and shall be responsible for submitting a proposed schedule of programs for the coming year to the Board of Directors for approval.
- c. The Second Vice President shall preside and perform all the duties of the President in the absence of the President and First Vice President and all other duties as may be prescribed by the President; shall serve as chairman of the Education Committee and shall be responsible for submitting a proposed schedule for workshops and training sessions for the coming year to the Board of Directors for approval.
- d. The Secretary shall keep the records of the meetings and conduct the correspondence of the Society and provide a copy of the minutes for the President before the next scheduled meeting.
- e. The treasurer shall receive and hold all funds of the Society in its name in insured financial institutions; keep an accurate account of receipts and expenditures; submit record books for audit by members in good standing of the Society; pay all bills by check in accordance with the approved budget; and shall assist the Membership Committee chairman in preparation of the membership directory by providing a list of paid members. The Treasurer shall serve as chairman of the Finance committee.
- f. The immediate Past President and the three Members-at-Large shall perform duties as assigned by the President and the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

- Section 1. Regular meetings of the Society shall be held monthly except in July and August.
- Section 2. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the regular monthly meeting in June. All officers and committee chairmen shall present written reports.
- Section 3. Special meetings of the Society may be called for one or more purposes by the President or upon written request of fifteen (15) members of the Society. Appropriate advance notice of five days will be provided all members.
- Section 4. A quorum shall consist of twenty members, including at least one of the following: President, First Vice President or Second Vice President.

ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall investigate policies and procedures for the Society and make recommendations to the membership.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Society between its business meetings, fix the hour and place of meetings, make recommendations to the Society, and shall perform such other duties as are specified in these bylaws. The Board of Directors shall be subject to the orders of the Society, and none of its acts shall conflict with action taken by the Society.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall meet quarterly and at called meetings as necessary.

ARTICLE VII - COMMITTEES

Confermed Section 1. All standing committees shall be appointed annually by the President and continued by the Board of Directors, with the President serving as an ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee, without the privilege of voting. Special committees shall be appointed by the Board of Directors as needed. The recommendations of each committee shall be subject to approval by the Board of Directors. The Society shall have the following standing committees:

- a. Education Second Vice President is chairman.
- b. Finance Treasurer is chairman.
- c. Historian
- d. Hospitality
- e. Library
- f. Membership to include notification of the meetings and updating of the surname directory
- g. Newsletter
- h. Program First Vice President is chairman.
- i. Publicity
- i. Research

ARTICLE VIII - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

"The rules contained in the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall govern the Society in all cases in which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the Society may adopt."

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

Section 1. With a quorum present, these bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote at any regular or special meeting called for that purpose. The proposed amendments will be given each member thirty (30) days prior to the meeting at which the action is to be taken.

ARTICLE X - DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the Cleveland County Genealogical Society, Inc., remaining assets, after the satisfaction of all obligations of the corporation, shall be distributed for purposes within the scope of Internal Revenue Service Code 501-(c) (3), or amendments thereof.
