Our largest source of net income continues to be from membership dues.

The next largest source is profits from the genealogy seminars. After expenses were paid from registration fees for the August 1989 Workshop, there was a profit of \$687. The Irish Workshop in October 1989 produced a small amount, and the German Workshop in March 1990 produced \$172.

During the year, registration fees for FFCC produced \$452 above expenses for the program.

A small profit continues from our publications (the marriage books and funeral home records indexes), something over \$100 above Printing costs.

After much work and study we have a temporary location for our library at 118 B Park Plaza II 1005 N. Flood, Norman. Moving began on July 15. Thanks goes to the library committee for their extensive effort. Studies will continue over the next 24 months for a permament location.

Meanwhile, the success and future of our library will depend solely on volunteers. Cataloging of materials will be very time consuming and we still have a long "wish" list in order to make our library complete and able to operate by early fall.

In addition to donations of books and other research materials, we are in need of the following items: 3 filing cabinets (4 or 5 drawer legal size), straight-back arm chairs (up to 6), typewriter (electric/correcting) and stand, a manual pencil sharpener, desk lamps, 2 or 3 hole punch, and an assortment of office supplies such as paper clips, pencils, 3x5 index cards, staplers, etc. Of course, money is always appreciated. All donors will recieve a receipt for tax deduction purposes.

# ACCURACY OF CENSUS

"The accuracy of a census record is in proportion to the accuracy of the enumerator and his informant, " and article in the South Bend, Indiana Tribune stated in 1986. Early records are especially vulnerable to inaccuracies, it has been found. The appointment of enumerators may be partly to blame for inaccurate results. People were selected for the job because of political affiliations, not literacy qualifications. This point was made clear by the Tribune columnist who offered the following letter written by a census taker.

"Ocupsyshien - census taker. I am a census taker for the city of Bufflow. Our city has groan very fast in resent years and now in 1865, it has become a hard and time consuming job to count all the peephill. There is not many that can do this work, as it is necessarie to have an ejucashun, which a lot of people still do not have. Another atribert needed for the job is good speling, for so many pephill to be counted can hardle speek inglish, let alon spel their names." ---Posted on the bulletin board of the National Archives via Madison Co, IA Gen Soc, 1st Quarter 1989

Great Britain---Phillimore's Marriages, Boyd's Marriage Index and
Register of Marriage Indexes for Great Britain are books available
on microfilm of the LDS (Mormon) Family History Library in Salt
Lake City, Utah, or its branches.

American Ancestors and Cousins of the Princess of Wales, by Gary Boyd Roberts and William Addams Reitwiesner (Genealogical Publishing Co., 1001 Calvert St., Baltimore, Md. 21202). Published in 1984, it covers through fifth cousins and lists 500 of the princess's closest American relatives.

United States---Mayflower Genealogies by George Ernest Bowman and List of Mayflower Passengers by Gov. William Bradford.

A quick source for locating a town is United States Postal Guides.

Burke's Presidential Families of the United States (usually in the reference section of most libraries)

# CIVIL WAR BOOK

Jim Mohon reports that one of our members, Linda Starr, has published an excellent book. W. R. Rankin: Manassas to Appomatox by Linda Sparks Starr is an account of four years of service in the Confederate Army recorded in the diary of Lt. William Robertson Rankin, Co.L, Palmetto (S.C.) Sharpshooters. Accompanying her analysis are maps and an index. For information on ordering a copy contact Linda Starr 2642 Brentwood, Norman, OK 73069.

Genealogists in need of locating place names no longer printed on Oklahoma state maps may find Ghost Towns of Oklahoma by John W. Morris (1978, University of Oklahoma Press) to be helpful.

In addition to town history, the names of counties, locations, maps, dates of postal service, and railroad information are given for 130 hamlets, villages, towns, and cities no longer in existence (which have been destroyed or covered by water), or remains may still stand but are largely unused, or the population has decreased at least 80% from its maximum.


