What's New About a Newsletter?

Are you a member of a genealogy society in addition to this one? Do you get a monthly newsletter? a quarterly? When you get your newsletter(s) what do you do? Choose the one best answer.

- a. Sit down and read it from cover to cover.
- b. Put it into your "I'll read it later" stack.
- c. Read it carefully watching for "your name".
- d. Read it while checking it against the Society Surname List.
- e. Toss it in the wastebasket.

Actually, all of the above are acceptable and any of them is preferable to (e). However, for the money you invest in newsletters and memberships in other societies and genealogy groups, (d) is your best investment.

The surname index is easy to use and any time you can match a name from your newsletter to the general surname list, you may be providing the very tiniest, misplaced piece of someone else's family jigsaw puzzle.

Give some time and thought to this cooperative effort. You'll be surprised at how much your work is appreciated and is often returned in kind. I once did this small service for a woman who lives in Virginia; she told her sister-in-law who lived in North Carolina; the sister-in-law told her neighbor who was going into South Carolina to research. About three weeks later we got a long distance call from the South Carolina researcher saying "We have found the Catherine Richardson who married Merrell Stewart and moved to Henderson County, Tennessee in 1854". They also discovered a Revolutionary War grandfather I didn't know I had.

If you have not turned in the surname list of the families you are researching, please do so, forms are at the library. If you do not have a copy of the existing surname booklet, pick one up from the library and start reading your newsletters for All The News That Fits Descent.

Take A Look At This

The current issue, Winter 1991 LXXXV #3, of The SAR Magazine, included a lengthy article on the "Real Sons" of the Revolutionary War.

According to the Veterans Administration about 350 thousand men and women fought the great war for our independence from England. In 1864, 83 years after the surrender at Yorktown, seven of these participants were living. By 1870, they had all died and in 1889 the National Society of the Sons of the Revolution was organized in New York.

Today, the SAR is made up of descendant sons. The original organization was strengthened by the presence and support of the real sons of the men who served in the war effort.

"Real Sons" were members of the SAR for about 50 years after its organization. These men were a superb source of oral history, although the term was not used back then, concerning their fathers' roles in the great conflict. Needless to say, their fathers were all heroes and rightly so.

The longest surviving "real son" was Oliver N. Abbott of South Carolina who was the son of John Abbott, South Carolina Militia. Ironically, the United States House of Representatives was about to honor him with a Revolutionary War pension when he died on January, 4, 1944.

There are many interesting details given about these "real sons" and the SAR is justifiably proud of every one, 226 in all. This, of course, is only a small percentage of the real sons of the participants in the Revolutionary War. They are the ones who are recorded in SAR.

Our new genealogical library is open three days a week and the SAR magazine cited here is available for you to use if you decide to come by and take a closer look!
