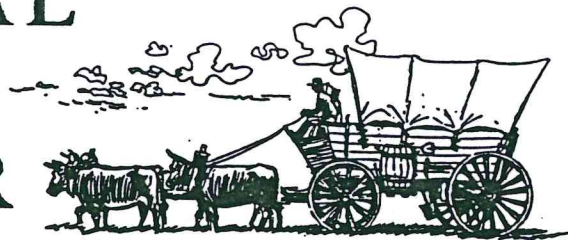

DO WE HAVE A GREAT PRESIDENT OR WHAT! Give our president, Dr. Clifton Brooks, a handshake of congratulations the next time you talk with him. After many years of diligent work, he has earned the honor to sign the rolls of the prestigious New York Society of the Cincinnati, which he will do November 2, 1991.

There are fourteen societies, one for each of the original thirteen states represented in the Continental Army, and the fourteenth represents the Frenchman, Lafayette.

To be eligible to sign the rolls, a person must show he or she is a direct descendant of a man who served three years in the Continental Army and only one person is allowed to represent that person.

Membership is by invitation only.

SHE'S A WINNER -- Edna Couch was again a two-time winner at the Oklahoma State Fair. A blue ribbon and a \$20.00 check was presented to her for her submission in the Genealogy category about the Couch family's settlement in 1889. Willow View Cemetery

The Willow View community was established in 1889. Located 4 miles east and 3 miles north of Lexington, it supported a grocery store, cotton gin, blacksmith shop, church and a two-room school.

In 1891, a free burial ground was opened to the community, Maud Ella Boydston, a seven months old baby was the first burial.

In 1898, William and Jane Boydston deeded one acre of land in the SE Quarter of the NE Quarter and Robert and Lucy Whisenant deeded one acre in the NE Quarter of the SE Quarter, both in Section 22, Township 7 North, Range 1 West of the Indian Meridian, to the Trustees of the Willow View Cemetery. The cemetery is located one mile west and one-half mile north of the Willow View community.

This list of the gravestones in the Willow View Cemetery was compiled by J. Albert Smith in 1990. A great number of the graves are not marked.

CLEVELAND COUNTY SCHOOLS

(From **GROWING UP WITH OKLAHOMA** by Orion Marcus McClain Burkett. Pages 122-128)

"...The schools named (most of them) will be those in which the writer worked. ...Each school in which the writer taught will be located. All will be in Cleveland County, Oklahoma. The year and some events about the people and the community will be mentioned.

Chapter 1, Denver School 1925-26

My first school to teach was at Denver, Oklahoma. Denver, Oklahoma is located on Dave Blue Creek in the southeast corner of Section 29-9N-1W in Cleveland County, Oklahoma. It was named for Denver Runyan, an early citizen of the Denver Community. At the time I taught the Denver School, there was a grocery store, a cotton gin, and a large church building. Up the hill south of the school was the Denver Cemetery. It still exists and is well kept. The location of the school building is above the waters of Lake Thunderbird. The school building is gone. The location of the cotton gin, the early post office, the grocery store and the church building lie beneath the waters of Lake Thunderbird.

It was my first time to ring the school bell as teacher. It was the 1925-26 school year. Denver was one of the last districts formed, due to its unusual location. After the town site disappeared, it was one of the first schools to be discontinued.

Small schools often became a liability rather than an asset to the annexing school. This was because of the limited amount of money raised from taxation on the annexed land and the high cost of transporting children long distances. At the Noble School (Cleveland County, Oklahoma) where the Denver School building was moved, some of the children sat in the Denver School building in the same seats as before, after having to ride at least ten miles to reach the Noble School. All of this changing from rural to city schools was due to shifting population from rural to city. This was called forced annexation. ...A law passed by the State Legislature required the annexation of any school district whose average daily attendance was less than 13 at the end of the school year.

At the age of twenty in the year of 1925, after graduating from the Noble High School at the age of 18, and after two years helping my parents, I found myself in the Denver Community. Having completed a summer normal school in Norman (Cleveland County, Oklahoma) taught by Miss Merle Austin Turner of Noble, I passed the teacher's examination.

When the certificate came I took it to Roy Champeau and Bert Barnhill, school board members at Denver School. If I accepted the offer it would be a salary of \$80.00 per month

for six months. There would be a two months summer school, two months for picking cotton, and a four-month winter school.

I secured board and room at the David Phillips home in the Capshaw district for six months.

...I thanked Mr. Champeau and Mr. Barnhill and took the job.

It proved interesting. I had been encouraged to teach my mother, Sarah Ann McClain Burkett, Miss Esther Monical, my seventh-grade teacher, Mrs. R. H. Barb, my eighth and ninth grade teacher, and Miss Merle Austin, of Noble.

IN THE David Phillips' home, I shared an upstairs room with Mr. Watson. Mr. Watson was the Capshaw School teacher. He was a member of the First Christian Church. Mrs. Phillips was a Baptist. Mr. Phillips was a Methodist. ... (At this time I was not a member of any church.)

Marvin Champeau was my oldest and largest student at Denv School. One time I taught two month summer school at Highland School so he could get his certificate finished. Two of his brothers are Orvil and Harold. They have been my friends for fifty years.

The Lee and Ledford family have been our friends for fifty years. I received a \$10.00 bill from Ola Lee on our fiftieth wedding anniversary. Her children are Reba, Audrey, Vernon, and Ferrill.

Clifford, Mildred, and Phylis (Ledford) went to Denver School. Also A. L. Sledge, who was my first first-grade student. He won a blue ribbon that year as best in the first-grade reading in the county. That was when there was a literary meet in the county schools every year.

Oh! Yes! and there was the Barnhill family. Three generations of them have been my students. Elvin and Alvin were twins. I never could tell them apart, because they called them Big N and Little N.

In 1941 I taught in the McKinley School in Norman. Foy Runyan was the principal. Denver Runyan is a brother to Foy and Nadine Runyan, and the Denver School was named after Denver Runyan.

When I retired from teaching in 1969, A. L. Sledge brought a picture of the original Denver School to Woodrow Wilson School in Norman.

I must not forget Evelyn Havill who made the highest grade in arithmetic. Everyone who lived around the Denver community remembers the Havill Hill. Evelyn Havill's grandfather was a Church of Christ preacher.

For the next twenty-two years the little Denver School remained an active school. Then on July 22, 1947, due to the low average daily attendance, the school was forced to annex to the Noble and Norman school districts.
