In The Library

Heritage Books, Inc. has published a book of ***Alleghany, North Carolina Marriages, 1849-1850***, by George Henry Latham. The book is a catalog of the marriages of this county which was and is a county where people can get married quickly. The extra large paperback, 27 cm. by 21 cm., has 354 pages of information with a preface that explains the symbols used in the volume. Mr. Latham extracted the information from hundreds of marriage certificates on file in the courthouse in Sparta, North Carolina.

The marriages are arranged alphabetically by the groom's surname. However, there is an index of bride's names with a cross-reference to the groom's. The records tell the marriage date, the ages of the wedding pair, and the parents of the couple. The latter information is seldom found on marriage records. The author found this information on other sources besides the marriage certificates.

The book simplifies examination of marriage records which were handwritten and often phonetic in spelling. The book should be helpful to anyone who has ancestors in southwestern Virginia or northwestern North Carolina.

The following is taken from the record of the board of county commissioners proceedings:

Saturday, October 7th, 1893
 Members present, J. M. DANIEL, W. L. ALLEN, and D. B. WYNN, county clerk. On motion of W. ALLEN, J. M. DANIEL was appointed chairman pro tem.

In the matter of a court house for Cleveland county, the following proposition and bill of sale for a court house for Cleveland county was this day presented by L. L. BRIGGS and others to-wit:

Bill of Sale

Whereas and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by W. H. BLACKWELL, chairman of the board of county commissioners of Cleveland county, Territory of Oklahoma, and said county, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to L. L. BRIGGS, S. B. OWENS, W. MARQUART, J. A. HULLUM, Tyler BLAKE, M. MCGINLEY, Geo. SMITH and J. A. JONES, the duly appointed and acknowledged building committee, to furnish and present to Cleveland county a convenient court house with all suitable offices and appurtenances thereto, and inasmuch as they are willing to sell, transfer, and by these presents deliver unto said Cleveland county the following named described property to wit:

Two-story brick building, lately completed, situated on block thirty-seven (37) in the original town of Norman Cleveland county, Territory of Oklahoma. That said building is free and clear from all incumbrances whatsoever, and that said building committee has a right to sell and dispose of the same and do guarantee the same to said county against any and all persons whatsoever.

Victory - Citizens Ticket Wins Six Republicans, Two Pops and Two Democrats Elected

The election in this city last Monday was a Waterloo for the Democratic ticket, and almost a clean sweep for the Citizens ticket. The ticket was composed of People's Party and Republicans, W. J. KELLEY, P. ADKINS and Tyler BLAKE, Councilmen are Republicans, Frank SMITH, City Marshal, is a Republican, and Chas. HARRINGTON City Treasurer is a Republican, and MINOR, City Clerk is a Republican, making six Republicans out of the twelve officers elected. The balance of the ticket are liberal democrats and populists. In fact the election was a Republican victory.

Pryor ADKINS ran like a scared wolf. Ditto KELLEY. BLAKE got there by one vote. Andy BERRY was elected by one vote. The Democrats got two officers, Constable and Justice of the Peace.

School Election

The west side school election last Tuesday resulted in electing Judge WILKINS Treasurer and the levy of ten mills tax. There was but little interest shown. The levy of ten mills insures the district a good school the coming school year.

Gone to Rest

Died: In Norman, Okla., April 12th, 1894, of that dread disease, consumption, Mrs. Emma H. **HUGHES** aged thirty-seven years and nine months. Funeral service was held in the Baptist church Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock, p.m. after which the body was taken to the Odd Fellow's Cemetery for interment.

Miss Emma H. **WALKER** was born August 12th, 1856, in Clinton County, Missouri. It was there where she spent her girlhood days; it was there where she met and married Mr. B. F. **HUGHES**, it was there where five bright little souls were born to her it was there where she learned to be a christian, and united with the Baptist church. There she had many friends who loved her and who hope that by coming here would be able to live many years; but alas, they are disappointed, they will never look into her sweet face again, she is gone from the world, she is dead, and all that was mortal lies cold and still in the Odd Fellow's Cemetery north of this city. The husband, the little motherless children and the other friends away have the sympathy of every citizen of Norman.

Mrs. **HUGHES** contracted the grippe about a year ago, which ran into quick consumption. Mr. **HUGHES** was advised to change climates, and therefore moved from Clinton county, Missouri, to this city, but the change did not seem to benefit her, and last Saturday night the soul took its flight.
